

## **CRISIS PREVENTION/RESPONSE PLAN**

The school board recognizes that schools are subject to a number of potentially dangerous events, such as natural disasters, industrial accidents, acts of terrorism, and other violent events. The board is committed to mitigating the effects of a potential crisis to the extent possible, in the schools and at school-sponsored activities.

The Crisis Prevention/Response Plan (CPRP) is implemented by the building administrator with oversight from the superintendent and input from public safety officials.

The CPRP will include, but not be limited to, fire safety, bomb threat, emergency and evacuation procedures, and catastrophe planning. The plan will be a facet of the instructional program of the school district. Implementation of the response plan will be appropriately geared to students at different grade levels.

The building administrator is responsible for the supervision of the CPRP for his/her school.

CPRP procedures will be readily available in all areas occupied by students and/or staff. The Crisis Prevention /Response Plan will be reviewed by the school board annually.
