

STUDENT ALLERGIES

The board recognizes that at any given time there may be students in our schools who have serious allergies. While the schools of SAU 50 cannot provide a totally allergen-free environment, the district will take reasonable steps to work with staff, students and their parents/guardians to minimize the risks of severe allergic reactions at school.

Prior to enrollment or upon identification of an allergy, the parent or guardian must provide current written documentation of the diagnosis from licensed medical personnel.

The board directs the superintendent, building administrators and school nurses to develop and implement appropriate procedures to address student allergies. It is understood that these procedures may vary from school to school.
